On Monday we welcomed our first Key Worker Bubble at Middleton Tyas and our Preschool and Reception Bubbles at Eppleby Forcett. The children have bounced happily into school every morning, with our Eppleby setting utilising music and bubbles to support the transition. All our children have done a fantastic job of following our new bubble rules.

There has been some super home learning and I am so impressed with the standard of work our children are producing. Year 6 have embraced transition and are being supported by our secondary colleagues on class dojo with maths and food technology challenges. In Year 5 the eco topic bank has prompted some excellent work on global issues, including 'plastic oceans'; endangered and vulnerable species of animals and eco-friendly home and car designs. Year 4 have been utilising ideas from their class novel 'There's a Pharaoh in the Bath'. They have been making postcards using hieroglyphics and creating maps that are stained with tea and coffee to make them look old. Year 3 children, and their families, are continuing to enjoy the regular story telling sessions from Mr Keane, who is keeping them enthralled chapter by chapter. Key Stage 1 have done some super work on their topic 'Wonders of the World'. This week they have been embracing Punjabi Bhangra Dance.
